Principal's Address – Week 10 Term 2

Term 2 has been very busy and productive with students involved in a number of activities and events to compliment their formal curriculum.

Exams & Reports

Our Year 10 and 11 students have engaged in exams this term and we are looking forward to reviewing their results. Each semester as part of our ongoing data review cycle in each learning area we review all student results and grade achievement data to identify patterns in student performance and strategies to promote improvement. Year 11 Semester 1 results will be reviewed very closely as we seek to identify strategies to support students to successfully manage and adapt to the significant increases in workload and expectation in Year 11, particularly in the ATAR pathway. Although our Year 11 students have embraced their first year of Senior School we've already identified the need to strengthen their skills to study and revise more consistently and help them to organise and manage their time more effectively to maximise their results in course assessments. We are committed as a College to supporting our students and equipping them with the necessary knowledge, skills and strategies to achieve their potential in Senior School to maximise their opportunity to access their desired post-school pathway. All parents should now have received their child's

Semester 1 reports from Year 7 – 11. I ask that you reflect on your child's report with them and review their progress together, identifying areas of strength and areas for improvement across the different subject areas.

Reviewing the Attitude, Behaviour and Effort (ABE) ratings is always the first place start as this will provide an insight as to your child's

approach to their learning in each subject. The ABE's are very much the 'process' that students need to get right in terms of their learning and if they do this consistently and model a positive mindset towards their learning, it will often lead to the 'outcome' of improved academic results and grade achievement in the next reporting cycle. Students are also encouraged to seek additional feedback from their teachers where necessary, so they are clear on what they must demonstrate in their classroom learning and assessments in order to evidence their achievement at a higher level.

Student Voice

To promote student agency and engagement in leading school improvement our Positive Support and Executive Teams have facilitated the development of a Student Voice Committee. The Committee will act as a representative body (of all students at CLC) that can put forward and implement approved ideas to improve the College and the educational experience for our students. The College Executive Team had their first meeting with the Student Voice Committee in week 10 to discuss the vision and the roles and responsibilities of the Committee. The students were impressive around their commitment to leadership, to implementing new initiatives and to working hand in hand with school leaders to continually improve the College culture and outcomes for the student body. More to share regarding the Student Voice Committee as it develops further in Semester 2, 2023.

On a personal note, can I thank the parent community for their support while I've had the privilege of being the Principal in Term 2, while Ms Kya Graves has been away enjoying a well-deserved long service leave break. It has been a privilege to lead our fabulous students, staff and parent community at CLC and its provided an outstanding professional learning experience for myself and one which I have absolutely enjoyed, so thank you and looking forward to an exciting Semester 2!!

We would all like to believe our children will always come to us for support, no matter what the circumstances. Unfortunately, this is unrealistic & sometimes we are the sticking point.


Please encourage each child to have 5 adults, in their network to talk to when life gets tough. Let's be honest it's not a case of 'if' but 'when' they need to talk things through.


Learning Area Update - Health

Year 7 Wood Work - CO, Dragsters

Our Year 7 Wood Work students have actively engaged in an exciting project focused around CO_2 Dragsters. Over the course of the semester, students have delved into comprehensive research, design, construction, and racing of their own CO_2 Dragsters, gaining valuable hands-on experience in Materials, Design, and Technology.

During the research phase, students learnt about the construction process of CO_2 Dragsters and explored various factors, such as mass, friction, and drag, that influence the speed of their vehicles. Subsequently, students translated their ideas into reality by crafting thumbnail drawings and concept sketches, ultimately refining their designs to reach the final iteration.

With their designs finalised, students embarked on the construction phase of their CO_2 Dragsters. This involved transferring their designs onto blocks of wood, carefully drilling holes for the axles, shaping the wood using files and sandpaper, adding personal touches through painting, and skilfully assembling the wheels and fishhooks, essential for manoeuvring the dragsters during races.

The culmination of their efforts arrived when students eagerly put their dragsters to the test, competing against their peers in exhilarating races. The project proved to be immensely enjoyable for students, who found great satisfaction in both the creation and racing of their ${\rm CO_2}$ Dragsters.
