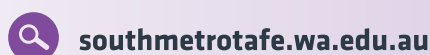

PATHWAYS TO EMPLOYMENT

South Metropolitan TAFE offers industry approved courses that provide relevant workplace skills at specialised industry training centres.

South Metropolitan TAFE students that complete a qualification will be on a pathway to their chosen career. Many students gain employment or go onto further training such as our certificates, diplomas, advanced diplomas, associate degrees or university.

PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY

South Metropolitan TAFE courses can provide pathways to university. On completion of a certificate IV or diploma, graduates can use their qualification to apply for a wide range of courses at university.

South Metropolitan TAFE has advanced standing agreements with Murdoch Univeristy, Curtin University, Edith Cowan University, the University of Notre Dame and the University of Western Australia in a range of bachelor degree courses.

LIFE AFTER VETDSS

Continue your studies at TAFE! Students that successfully complete a VETDSS course with South Metropolitan TAFE are automatically eligible to continue into the next level of the qualification. This applies to non-competitive courses only.



How do students apply?

FEES AND CHARGES

Secondary school students undertaking VETDSS courses as part of their secondary education including pre-apprenticeships in schools courses are exempt from tuition, resource and enrolment fees. However depending on the chosen course students may be required to purchase a uniform, protective equipment, text books or trade equipment/tools.

ATTENDANCE

Students are responsible for ensuring they attend all scheduled classes. Attendance will be recorded and any absences are reported to the school. The VET coordinator at your school will be contacted to discuss the appropriateness of a student continuing if there are repeated absences. Students are required to inform their lecturer in advance if they will be absent from any scheduled classes. Poor attendance may mean withdrawal from the course.

DRESS CODE

Students are not required to wear their school uniform to their course but they are expected to dress appropriately.

Where special or protective clothing and/or footwear is required, it must be worn without exception. Students who forget to bring their protective clothing will be excluded from the campus workshops/classes and the school informed.

VETDSS APPLICATIONS FOR 2022 OPEN JULY 2021

To complete the online application students will require:

- A School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA) number (this can be found on your school report or speak with your VET Coordinator.
- A Unique Student Identifier (USI) - to obtain this you will need to visit usi.gov.au.
- Parent/guardian email address and mobile phone number.
- Last year's and semester 1 school report in electronic format i.e. PDF.
- Resume, references and/or certificates which will help support your application.
- A student statement outlining why you should be chosen for the course (maximum of 500 characters).

VETDSS courses are extremely competitive and it is recommended that as much evidence as possible is provided to support the application. These documents must be uploaded when applying through our online application system.

Applications can be submitted online at southmetrotafe.wa.edu.au/futurestudents/vetdss

Instructions on how to apply will be provided to school VET coordinators. Students should liaise with their VET coordinator before attempting to apply.

The school will be asked to endorse and support all applications before the selection process begins.

Courses run subject to minimum numbers.

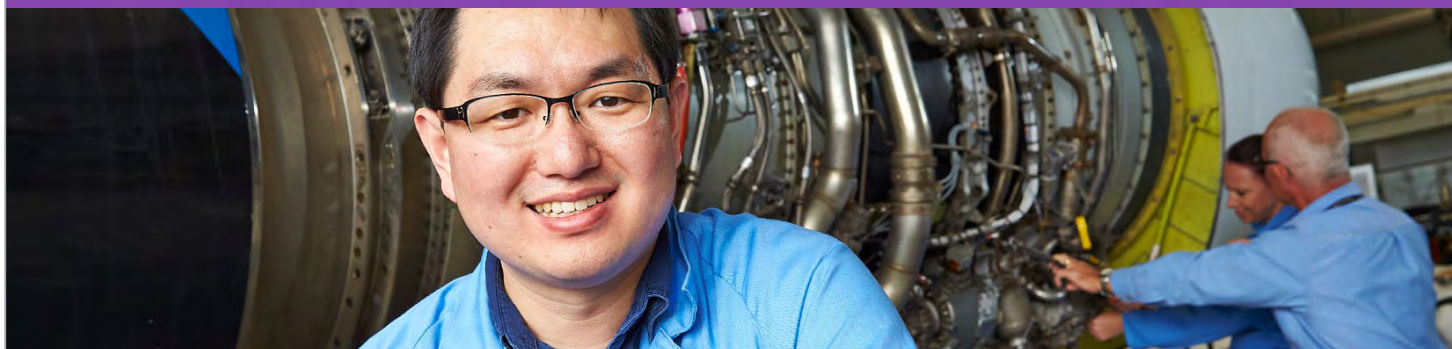

MEA20418 Certificate II in Aeroskills (Mechanical Pre-Apprenticeship)



Course Outline

This one-year qualification for Year 11 or 12 students provides the initial skills and knowledge required for a highly sought-after career in aircraft maintenance as a pathway to becoming an aircraft engineer. Students will learn about the fundamentals of aircraft airframe systems, electrical systems, instrumentation, hydraulics systems, pneumatics systems, mechanical control systems, safe work practices, test equipment and more.

Students will gain invaluable practical experience in an operational aircraft hangar workshop, enabling them to learn the necessary hand skills and standards that are required in the industry. Upon successful completion students will receive course credit into South Metropolitan TAFE's Certificate IV in Aeroskills (if selected by an employer as an aircraft maintenance engineering apprentice).

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AVI30219 Certificate III in Aviation (Cabin Crew)

Course Outline

Are you ready to let your dreams soar?

This course is designed for Year 12 students who are seeking an exciting career in the aviation industry as Cabin Crew (Flight Attendants).

The majority of the practical training will be conducted on South Metropolitan TAFE's very own Boeing 737. Its full-length cabin includes business and economy class seating, operational galleys, cabin service equipment and PA system.

Students will learn how to evacuate down a slide, about (simulated) cabin fires with smoke, firefighting, ditching and life raft training. The practical skills and knowledge gained in this qualification will be used to facilitate the safety and comfort of passengers and other crew members.

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AVI30419 Certificate III in Aviation (Remote Pilot)



Course Outline

This the highest qualification available for high school students wanting to obtain a Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) Remote Pilot Licence (RePL) and develop industry leading skills within the remotely piloted aircraft system (RPAS) industry.

Obtaining your Remote Pilots Licence (RePL) is the first step to being able to operate remotely piloted aircraft systems (RPAS), otherwise known as drones or UAV's for commercial or business purposes without weight or operating restrictions.

Students completing this qualification can pursue employment opportunities in the industry or use the qualification as a pathway into further studies at a certificate IV, diploma or advanced diploma level. Alternatively, students can explore certificate III qualifications in aviation, for example pilot studies, aviation management, flight attendant, helicopter and rescue crewman.

Whilst training in an airport environment, students will learn about aircraft, aerodynamics, navigation, as well as aviation first aid, dangerous good handling, aircraft refuelling, basic fire extinguisher training and more.

Students successfully completing this course receive credit towards the Diploma of Aviation (Commercial Pilots Licence) and a number of other aviation qualifications.

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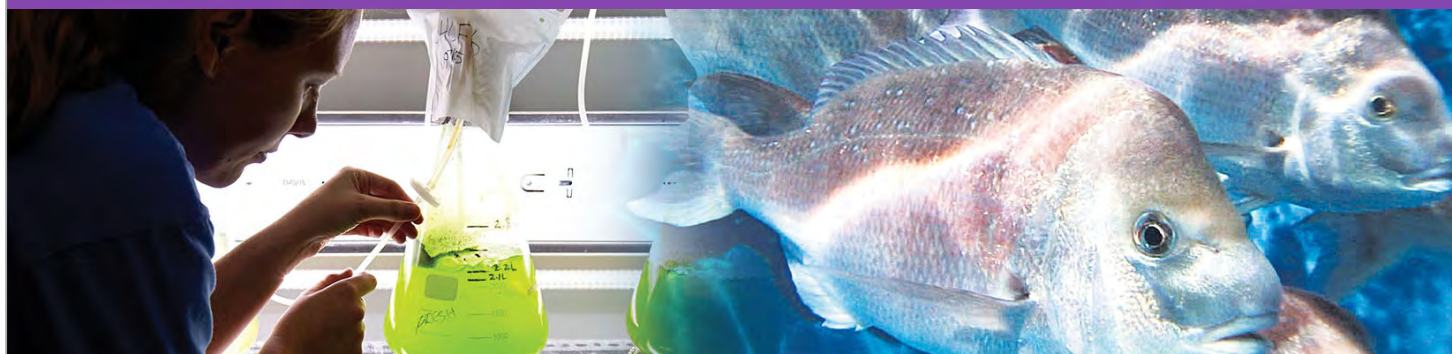


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SFI20119 Certificate II in Aquaculture

Course Outline

Turn your passion for fishing into a career!

This qualification will give you the basic skills you need to start work in the fishing sector of the seafood industry. You will gain a good understanding of routine processes and procedures, including maintaining fishing gear, operating small vessels and using deck equipment. You will also acquire knowledge in seafood processing such as temperature control of the produce and how to handle, harvest and sort by catch. You will learn about marine communication so that you can understand shipboard orders and be able to follow safe work practices in case of emergencies. If you were a deckhand on a small vessel, you would be expected to assist in the operation and maintenance of fishing gear and equipment and have some basic marine science skills, which this course will provide.

You will gain knowledge and skills in:

- Assisting with operation of fishing gear and equipment
- Basic processing and temperature control of harvest
- General cleaning and maintenance of equipment and vessel, and
- Handling, harvesting and sorting by catch.

Launch your career in science with this entry-level course that qualifies you to work as a laboratory assistant in food technology, pathology, chemistry as well as schools or trades.

Gain these skills:

- collect and prepare samples
- measure and record the results of experiments
- perform microscopic examinations
- prepare working solutions
- maintain and work in a laboratory in the physical, chemical, biological and life sciences

Learn these skills:

This qualification provides the skills and knowledge required for entry level role in laboratory. Laboratory technicians assist chemists, scientists or other laboratory staff by collecting samples and conducting laboratory tests in a broad range of contexts (chemical labs, food quality testing, construction material testing, biological tests, water testing to name a few) and recording results for further analysis and experiments.

Students learn in a fully equipped laboratory enabling them to develop and gain highly valuable practical skills for their future career.

This qualification will also prepare you for multiple pathways such as transition and completion of certificate IV in Laboratory techniques (further 6 months) , transition into Health professions, or into university.

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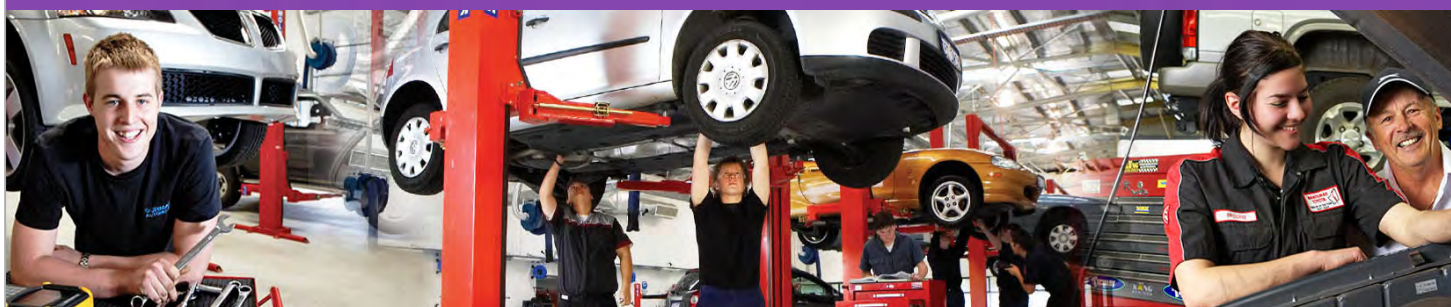


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AUR20716 Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation (Light, Heavy and Electrical Rotation)

Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation students will cover three specifications of the automotive industry light, heavy and electrical. Within the light component they will learn fundamentals of mechanical workings and servicing of passenger and light commercial vehicles. As they move to the heavy focus students gain an understanding of large trucks, basic industrial mining equipment. Finally, the electrical component focuses on the inner wirings of automotive equipment across both heavy and light vehicles.

- Learn basic use of automotive workshop equipment, safe work practices and manual handling skills
- Learn the basic purpose and features of vehicle systems

52824WA Certificate II in Building and Construction (Pathway Trades)

Course Outline

Do you have a way with wood and a building desire?

This qualification is designed to provide the learner with foundation skills therefore enhancing apprenticeship prospects in the building and construction industry which is experiencing a current skills shortage.

Students who attend Mandurah Campus will complete their second year at Rockingham Campus. This program has a carpentry and joinery focus as well as covering common core competencies shared between many construction trades.

Students learn skills in handling construction materials, basic hand skills, reading building plans, measuring and calculations. This qualification has an emphasis on the practical aspects of building and construction and will include a number of basic construction projects constructed on campus as part of the training course which complements their classroom studies.

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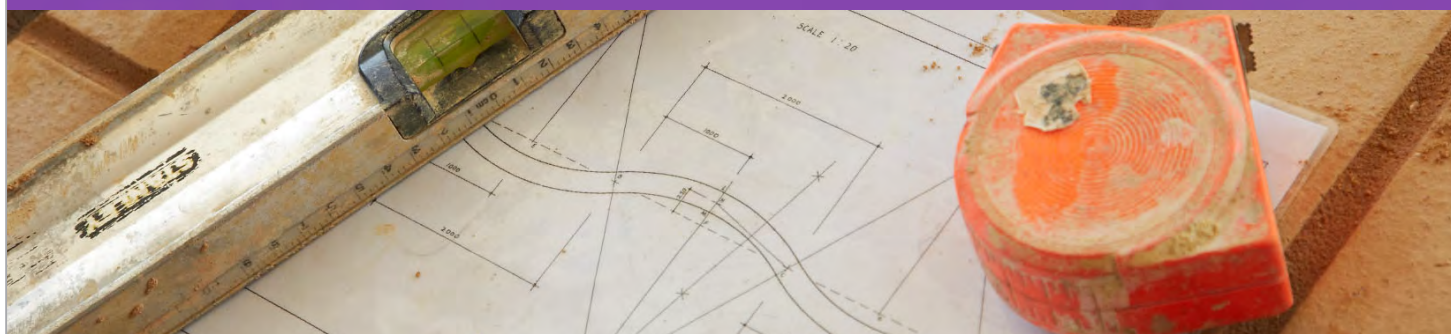

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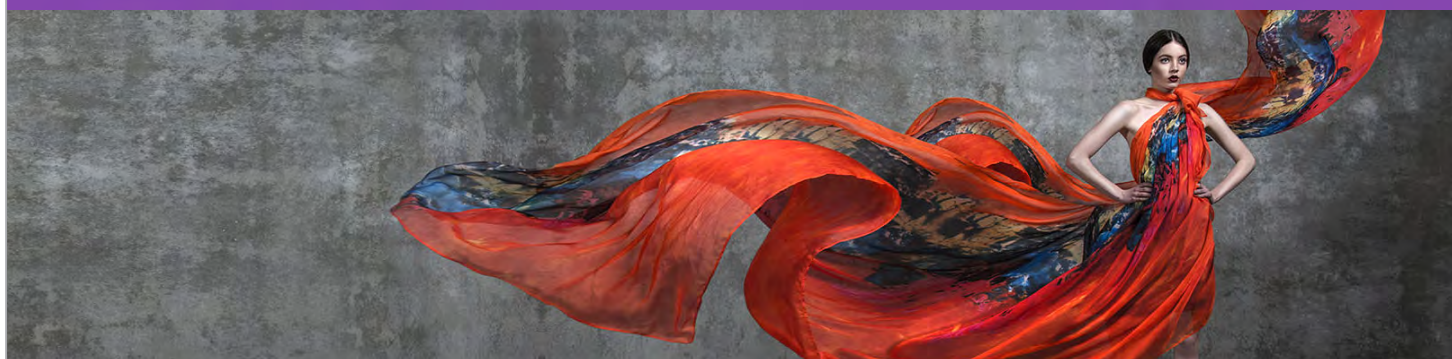
