Bike Skills Program

Over the course of weeks 5 to 8 of Term 4, the College provided 12 students with an opportunity to engage in the Bike Skills Program. The Bike Skills Program is a joint initiative between Coastal Lakes College and our partners including; KD Cycles, Your Move, the Department of Transport and West-Cycle. West Cycle are the peak body for bike riding throughout Western Australia. The Bike Program is committed to increasing bike; education, participation, safety and the skill-development of young people to promote their active engagement in bike-riding and a healthy, active and safe lifestyle.



The Bike Skills Program is designed to engage students in a hands-on, practical learning experience over a five-week period to develop knowledge of bike maintenance and skills in; problem-solving, teamwork, interpersonal communication, decision-making and perseverance.

The students also learnt how to turn, brake and control their bike in tight spaces by engaging in different bike circuits that targeted different practical skills

The Program was inclusive of students from Inclusive Education, Integrated Learning and from general education and providing a great social opportunity for students from across the College to learn, socialise and work together with a common focus.

The students had access to our brand new fleet of bikes which we have purchased following a successful funding application from Satterly and from the points we have accrued from Your Move for promoting biking as a healthy, safe and sustainable mode of transport. The College raised over \$11,000 from Your Move throughout 2023 which has enabled us to purchase 7 mountain bikes and two 3-wheeler bikes for students with disabilities or who have never ridden a bike before.

The Bike Program delivered some excellent outcomes with some students learning to ride a bike for the first time, other students learning how to maintain their bike, while other students advanced their practical riding skills. The students were all provided with a certificate for their participation in the course and the feedback we received from them was very positive about the program. The College will be running the Bike Program again in 2024 and we intend to add to our growing fleet of bikes to ensure the program can be fully inclusive.

Can I take this opportunity to thank Mrs Lucinda Devlin for working in partnership with me to drive the Bike program, along with Mr Ashvin Nair for his support with completing funding applications this year. We look forward to further building and consolidating the Bike Program in 2024.

Guest Soccer Coach

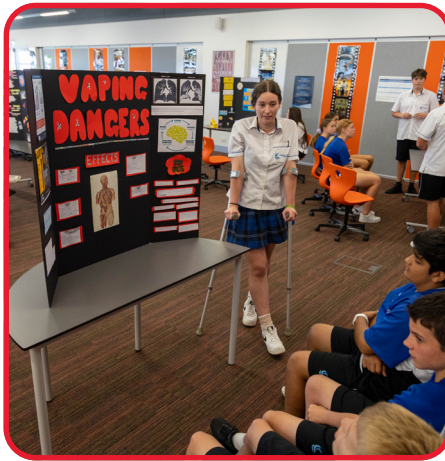

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Learning Area Update - STEAM

Year 10 Advanced Math

Our Year 10 Advanced Math students recently participated in a series of STEAM Challengers organized by the prestigious Australian National University (ANU). The students showcased their mathematical prowess and problem-solving skills, earning accolades and demonstrating the exceptional talent within our College community.

Throughout the competition, our students tackled a diverse range of problems that required not only mathematical abilities but also creative thinking and collaborative skills. The challenges were designed to push the boundaries of conventional learning, encouraging participants to apply their mathematical knowledge to real-world scenarios.



Year 11 Engineering

Our Year 11 ATAR Engineers spent the semester diving into mechatronics and mechanical engineering. They built remote control vehicles from scratch, carefully choosing electronic components, creating a unique steering system with 3D printed parts, and coding every aspect. The process included extensive CAD designing, covering everything from LED holders to an advanced Ackerman steering system.

Some students, initially inspired by mining vehicles, switched to designing racing cars, demonstrating adaptability and creativity. This project not only enhanced technical skills but also promoted teamwork and critical thinking.

We applaud our Year 11 engineers for their dedication and innovation, eagerly anticipating the reveal of their creations.



Year 11 Resin Workshop

Year 11 General Woodwork students got hands-on with a resin incursion. Led by Haida and Jemma from Resin the Bar, the workshop gave students a chance to explore their artistic side.

The class gave students two options to create their cheese boards: using colourful pigments or dried flowers for their resin creations. Those going floral were required to plan their design, pouring resin halfway to let the flowers set. The next day, they filled the space to create a 3-dimensional design. Those using pigment were able to stir coloured powders and glitter through the liquid resin to create mesmerising patterns.
