Business Plan


To support high quality teaching in every classroom across the College we have trained instructional coaches who work in partnership with individual teachers to set individual goals so teachers can become more expert at their craft. Instructional coaching is an evidenced based strategy to drive



improvement in instructional practice of all teachers through a process of identifying goals for improvement, learning the strategies to enhance instruction and then practicing these strategies (with a coach) to improve their teaching practice.

Instructional coaches play an important role in building the capability of graduate teachers and teachers who are new to the College. They induct new teachers into our preferred model of teaching which as outlined in our Coastal Lakes College Teaching, Learning and Assessment Framework, which clearly communicates our school-wide approach to quality teaching. Our coaching program has been integral to sustaining quality teaching across the College as we have continued to grow each as a College with more than 15 new teachers joining the College each year as we have gained a new year group. At Coastal Lakes College we believe that despite how long you have been teaching (and we have a number of highly experienced teachers) there is always room for every teacher grow and improve their practice and to challenge themselves with new goals that take their teaching to an even higher level.

This is about building a teaching culture amongst staff where every teacher is committed to ongoing improvement, the same way we ask students to commit to ongoing improvement as a learner and a person while at high school. The Karnup Network schools are 'trailblazers' across the state with their instructional coaching programs (Coastal Lakes College included) and the network has this as a shared strategic priority to drive excellence in teaching and learning. Coastal Lakes leads this network collaboration which brings together instructional coaches from across our local primary and secondary schools to share coaching approaches, professional learning and strategies to use coaching as a vehicle to drive better teaching and learning outcomes in our schools. Below is a graphic that summarises our approach to instructional coaching here at Coastal Lakes College. Survey data from our staff indicates that 96% of staff who have engaged in coaching believe it is an effective way to help them improve their classroom practice, which is excellent data.

The First Female Head Coach For WA State Girls AFL Team

We caught up with Coastal Lakes College Maths teacher, Sarah Christensen to share her thoughts on being the first female Head Coach for the WA state girls AFL team.

CLC: What makes this appointment special to you?

SC: Being the first female head coach is important for me to show the young women playing that it is possible to be a coach. As I was in the first state schoolgirls team (as a player) in 1999, it is a full circle moment for me. CLC: How long have you been involved with AFL both as a player and a coach?

SC: I have played, umpired and coached for the past 30 years. I have played for Secret Harbour, WA state schoolgirls, Cairns Tigers, Royal Australian Navy team, Combined services and school team. I have field umpired over 200 games in Peel Football League and in my eighth year of coaching. I started coaching my daughter in Auskick and grew from there.

CLC: Can you share a special memory you have as either a player or coach?

SC: In 1999 they selected the first ever WA state schoolgirls team. We didn't get to fly over east, so we just versed local area schools. When the bus came to Mandurah, I ran off the bus and swapped out my state jumper to pull on a Peel Thunder one to play with my friends. We lost that game and it was raining but I had the time of my life.

It is my favourite game ever as I finally got to see AFL as a sport for women and dreamt of possibilities for the future.

CLC: What tips would you have for anyone looking to start coaching AFL?

SC: There is a massive push for female coaches at the moment with the WAFC providing loads of programs. My tip would be to teach the young teams at a local club or become an assistant for a sibling's team.

Then never forget how much you love the sport, so they can love it under your coaching. It is very rewarding.
